What you'll need

- A lightweight plant pot
- Coloured paints
- Sticky tape
- Coloured card
- Shredded paper
- Paintbrush
- Hard-boiled eggs
- White paper
- Old newspaper

Easter basket bonanza!

These beautiful baskets will make your Easter extra egg-citing!



Start here!

1 First, cut the white paper lengthways, so that you have a strip about 10cm wide. You might need two separate strips, depending on the size of your plant pot.

2 Now, put the old newspaper on a flat surface, place the white paper on top and use the paints to decorate it with a colourful pattern.

3 Once the paint has dried, you can use sticky tape to carefully attach the decorated paper strip (or strips) to the pot.

TOP TIP!
After Easter, why not plant some flowers in your pot – so you can brighten up your home!

4 Next, cut a length of coloured card about 5cm wide and stick each end to the inside of the plant pot to create a handle.

5 Finally, paint the hard-boiled eggs, wait for them to dry and then place them in the basket on top of the shredded paper. Now you're ready for Easter!
