# DAY OF THE DEAD PIZZA

Cook up a scrumptious skull for your Halloween celebrations...

**Start here!**



### What you'll need

- Ready-made pizza base
- Pizza sauce or tomato purée
- Mozzarella
- Black olives, some sliced, others halved
- Cherry tomatoes, halved
- Mushrooms, sliced
- Red onion, sliced
- Peppers, sliced
- Tinned sweetcorn



**1** Carefully trim a small amount from either side of your pizza base to make a skull shape.



**2** Cover the base with pizza sauce.



**3** Cut pieces of mozzarella for the eyes, the nose and the mouth shape, and a triangle to decorate the forehead.



**4** Add black olives for the teeth, pupils and nose, then add two rounds of pepper for the eyes. Now decorate the rest of the skull using the other veggies. Check out the pictures on these pages for inspiration!



**5** With the help of an adult, cook in a pre-heated oven (see pizza-base packet for instructions), then tuck in!

**TOP TIP**  
Ask an adult to help you slice all the veggies!

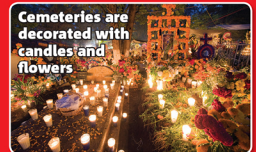
