

#### **Remembrance Day**

On 11 November, people across the country remember those who lost their lives in wars...

Sadly, nearly 17 million people died as a result of the First World War. The last surviving veteran, Harry Patch, passed away on 25 July 2009 (aged 111). He was lovingly known as the Last Fighting

The war ended on the 11th of the 11th month in 1918. A year later. King George V announced that those who died would be honoured with a two-minute

Around this time of year, hour of the 11th day : people wear paper poppies as a way to raise money for war veterans and remember those who died. It's said poppies were the first flowers to silence every year at : bloom on battlefields 11am on 11 November: after the war.

Remembrance 3 Sunday takes place this year on 12 November. The Queen will lay a poppy wreath at the Cenotaph war memorial in

Lots of people love this night of fireworks, treacle toffee and, of course, bonfires! But do you know why we Remember, remember the 5th of November? Well, it's the anniversary of the Gunpowder Plot, a failed attempt to blow up Parliament in 1605.

Back then, England was ruled by King James I, who followed the Protestant form of Christianity. Angry with the way he was treating Catholics, a group of men including Guy Fawkes - hatched a plot to destroy the Houses of Parliament, with the King inside

But before the attack could happen, Guy Fawkes was caught red-handed - along with fuses, matches and 36 barrels of gunpowder, Oops! Since then, people have made bonfires on which they burn the 'Guy' - a dummy made to represent Mr. Fawkes. The event is also known as Guy Fawkes Night





It's not just us humans who have the brains to invent handy gadgets. Check out eight other incredible animals that make and use tools...




#### OCTOPUSES

The kings of hide and seek, octopuses (or octopi) can change their shape, colour and even skin texture to blend in with their surroundings. But some of these incredible invertebrates have another trick up their, errr... tentacles! In the waters off Indonesia in Southeast Asia, veined octopuses make portable hiding places – from coconut shells! Scientists have observed the super swimmers carrying halved coconut shells that they've collected off the ocean floor. Then, when they sense danger, they hide under them or assemble the shells around their bodies to make safe shelters. Peekaboo!



#### **ELEPHANTS**

Elephants are super-strong animals, equipped with muscular trunks and bulky bodies. But did you know they have brilliant brains as well as brawn? These massive mammals have a special way of storing water – they dig water holes, which they fill with chunks of chewed-up tree bark and cover with sand. This stops the water from evaporating, so the elephants can return to the hole whenever they fancy for a cheeky drink! The nifty nellies make other tools, too – they use long sticks to scratch those hard-to-reach itches, and bushy branches to swat away pesky files. Swish swish!





#### NEW CALEDONIAN CROWS

Meet some fab fliers who prove our feathered friends can be expert tool-makers, too! Native to New Caledonia in the South Pacific. these cool crows use sticks to extract scrummy bugs hiding in cracks and crevices in logs. But here's the really impressive bit - the brainy birds use their feet and beaks to bend twigs into a hook shape, making them more effective grub-grabbers! The crows insert their well-crafted tools into the insects' hidey holes and then shake them about until the prey latch on. Then, they pull out the twig with the bug attached. Voilà, it's creepy-crawly kebabs for dinner!



### LONG-TAILED MACAQUES

It turns out humans aren't the only ones who take dental hygiene seriously. So do Thailand's long-tailed macaques, who've found the perfect tool to clean their teeth with – human hair! Some of the cheeky critters living by a Buddhist shrine in the city of Lopbur! have been seen flossing their teeth with strands of hair they've snatched from passing people. Ouch! What's more, the macaque mums sit face to face with their youngsters, teaching them how to floss. No hair within reach? The mischlevous monkeys make do with coconut fibres and twigs instead. Say cheese!





# BADGER RESCUE

An orphaned baby gets a second chance...

During a torrential rainstorm in Somerset, a farmer heads outside to check on his sheep. The flock is safe, but he stumbles across another animal in serious trouble. Lying motionless on the ground is a tiny, almost furless badger cub. The farmer notices a flicker of life, so he tucks the tiny creature into his pocket and drives to a nearby animal rescue centre.

#### ROAD TO RECOVERY

By the time the cub arrives at Secret World Wildlife Rescue, it's wriggling and making a badger's distinctive chirping sound. The staff are pleased to see that the female cub has no wounds or parasites. "She's so perfect," says Pauline Kidner, founder of Secret World. "But she's very young." Less than 48 hours old, the little animal is vulnerable to many serious health problems.

#### JUST WARMING UP

The tiny baby badger's mother would not have willingly abandoned her cub. Badgers live underground in family burrows called setts. Pauline believes the cub's home flooded during the storm and the mother lost the newborn while moving her other cubs to a dry, backup sett.


The biggest concern for Gale – named after the windy storm she was found in – is her low body temperature. The staff place the orphan in a warm incubator and give Gale a hot water bottle wrapped in a towel and a teddy to snuggle up to. Once the baby badger has warmed up, Pauline starts feeding her milk. Newborn badgers eat very little, very often – about once an hour, 24 hours a day – so Pauline sleeps on a chair with Gale on her lap, feeding her with a medicine syringe throughout the night.



#### **BACK TO THE WILD**

When Gale is six weeks old she opens her eyes for the first time. At ten weeks she begins to crawl around on her shaky legs, and once the little badger starts scoffing solid foods, she's moved into a small pen where human contact is minimised. "Otherwise they grow up thinking they're human beings," Pauline says. Two weeks later, Gale Joins a group of other badgers. During four months of preparation for release, the badgers live in an artificial sett, learn survival skills, and get their first taste of wild badger food – earthworms. Yum!

When Gale is eight months old, she and five other badgers are transported to the countryside. Here, a temporary sett has been built and sectioned off with a circular fence. A month later, after the badgers have learned to forage and dig their own



sett, the fence is removed. Pauline admits that she's a little sad to see Gale go. "It's fantastic, though," she says, "because the whole point is to get that badger back into the wild." Aww-some work, Pauline!

#### COUNTRIES BATTLE OVER BIRD POOP


CHINCHA ISLANDS, PACIFIC OCEAN Battles have been fought over many things taxes, oil, spices... poop? Yep. A two-year battle over Islands covered in bird poo, or guano, broke out between Peru and Spain during the 1860s. Why the fuss over faeces? At the time, guano was in high demand as a fertiliser. And it turns out the dry climate of the Chincha Islands in the Pacific Ocean perfectly preserves the guano left by seabirds. In fact some guano piles reportedly stood 45m tall! Spain wanted to take control of the Islands from Peru, a former colony. But the the Islands from Peru, a former colony. But the Peruvian government refused - and fighting broke out. Peru won the war, and to this day

#### remains the owner of the precious poop.

#### EAFLOOR CITY

n 2015, China surprised the world when it announced it had secretly when it announced it had secretly set up a 'city' of 1,000 people on the seafloor off the country's southeastern coast. Encased in a see-through dome, Seafloor City is protected from the ocean elements by a 335-m-thick transparent material developed in a lab in the city of Shanghai. At 5km², the city is small but it's packed with the nation's smartest scientists. The government has tasked them with studying how people tasked them with studying how people might live on other planets, and how the human body can adapt to life underwater. Seafloor City is set to become a major tourist destination next year, but only expert divers will be able to reach it.





ROBOT HITCHHIKES ACROSS CANADA

#### VICTORIA, CANADA

Would you give a ride to a talking, hitchhiking robot? Well, 19 carloads of Canadians did exactly that during the summer of 2014, helping the child-sized hitchBOT travel 6,000km from Halifax to Victoria. Anyone who offered hitchBOT a ride had to lift it into and out of the car because only its hitchhiking arm moved. But hosts were rewarded with a robot that could chat with its companions and share facts about the region the car was travelling through. The bot had tons of 'fun' along the way, sightseeing, making new friends, riding a ferry and even attending a wedding!

#### PLANTS MAKE MUSIC

LOS ANGELES, USA

Did you know that plants can be 'musical'? Technology developed by a company called Data Garden translates the electrical currents moving across a plant's surface into sounds. The company have organised 'concerts' and installations, and they've even created a radio station, Plants FM, which livestreams plant music: So what does this tell us about the secret life of plants? Scientists still aren't quite sure. But thanks to a successful fundraising campaign, anyone with a computer can now find out whether their houseplants can 'sing'!



## **HOW TO SPOT**

This page may just be a fun game, but can you always believe everything you read? Sometimes it's hard to tell the difference between real-life headlines and made-up ones - especially on the internet. Some people are trying to trick you on purpose. Follow these tips for sniffing out fake news...

Does the story come from a newspaper, magazine or website you've never heard of?

"Well-known news sources aren't likely to try to fool you," says Eric Carvin, social media editor for the Associated Press. "If you haven't heard of a publication, do some research on how trustworthy they are before you take what they say as fact. Have they been accused of publishing fake news before? If so, they may not be reliable."

"If a story is real, then many newspapers and magazines will cover it," Eric says. "Big stories worth reporting on are usually featured in more than just one or two publications."



"If no experts or eyewitnesses are mentioned in the article, that's a warning sign," Eric says. "Most publications try to speak with at least two sources to back up a story."





#### Join us as we travel to Arizona in the USA to see some cool cacti in the hot, hot desert!

We picked a toasty time to visit it's July, and Arizona is right in the middle of an almighty heat wave! The temperatures are so extreme (up to 48°C) that some planes have been unable to take off, and brave fire crews have been

to take off, and brave fire crews have been battling wildfires across Arizona and all over western USA.

To beat the heat, we're visiting Saguaro National Park at 5 am, before the temperatures get dangerously high. "We recommend that visitors complete their outdoor activities by 9 am," explains Park Ranger Cam Juarez, as we trek through the as we trek through the dusty landscape. This protected park is in the wast 260,000km² Sonoran

Desert, which stretches across southwestern USA and Into Mexico.

"Listen for rattling sounds and keep scanning the ground," warns Cam. "This is about the time that the rattlesnakes start slithering back to their underground burrows – it's too hot for them in the day." To avoid the

temperatures many desert animals, such as scorpions or tarantulas, are nocturnal, and others, such as snakes and rodents. are only active in the early morning or late evening when it's cooler. Black-tailed jackrabbits, who are out and about all day, have huge ears which help disperse heat (see bottom), and Harris's antelope squirrels hold their tails above their heads for shade. Clever!

Cacti have a surprising way of keeping cool, too – their spines! Not only do the spikes provide protection, they also cast slender shadows, keeping the surface shaded. Of the 25 types of cacti that grow in the Sonoran Desert, the most famous is the mighty saguaro (say 'sa-war-oh'), which the park is named after (see main pic).

These giant green columns tower over us, their 'arms' held aloft as if they're waving! "The tallest can grow 16 metres, and they weigh up to ten tonnes during the rainy season - so don't park your carnext to one!" laughs Cam.
He might be joking, but these
majestic plants do occasionally
topple over in strong winds.
That's because their roots—

which stretch out as far as the cacti are tall - are remarkably shallow, just 10-15cm in depth!

AGUARO HOTEL

Gazing up at the saguaros, we notice little birds darting in and out of holes in their sides. "Gila woodpeckers peck nests into the cactus flesh", explains Cam. "A kind of 'scab' forms on the inside, which stops the cactus oozing liquid and creates a dry, Insulated cavity." Once the original baby birds have flown the nest, other birds move in - some saguaros here are home to elf owls, screech owls, finches and sparrows!

It's been hotting up as we walk, and now the sun is beating down big time.
Unfortunately, we're way too bulky to crawl into a cool cactus cavity, so we retreat to the blissfully air-conditioned car, with a new found respect for the desert dwellers of the Sonoran Desert!

Accordion-like pleats expand when It rains, so the cactus can swell up and hold more water!

The Sonoran desert has a short, summer rainy season with violent thunderstorms. It even snows sometimes!

> Extreme temperatures, such as frost, can cause cactus arms to flex and bend

downwards

Drawings known as petroglyphs have been found on rocks in the park – they're around 1,000 years old!

Javelinas (say 'have-a-leenas') look like wild boars. They love to eat prickly pear cacti, but will also scoff dead lizards and rodents! Turn over to meet some more amazing animals from the Sonoran Desert...

Meet five freakishly ferocious species from the Sonoran Desert...

#### ROADRUNNER

"Forget snakes and scorpions - I'd say this little bird is one of the most victous, cold-blooded killers in the Sonoran Desert!" marvels Ranger B. He's a ranger at Usery Mountain Regional Park, one of Arizona's many protected parks, and he knows a thing or two about the species here! The super-speedy bird, Ranger B explains, can run along the ground at up to 30kmph - outrunning most humans - and it has top hunting skills, too. "If it sees prey, such as a rattlesnake, it quickly grabs it, then smashes the head against the ground to kill it," he says. "I've even seen roadrunners carrying dead prey around all day in their mouths like a packed lunch. They take chunks when they're feeling peckish." Nom!

Staying safe in the desert is easy if you stick to the trails! Venomous wildlife doesn't like human contact and will only ever attack If threatened!

# 0000 This really IS a GRASSHOPPER MOUSE

Meet another surprising Arizona assassin - the grasshopper mouse! This 12-16-cm-long rodent might look cute, but it's a fearsome and aggressive hunter. As well as eating other mice and stealing their burrows, this furry fighter can take down terrifying tarantulas and scary scorpions with ease. Scientists think it could even be immune to a scorpion's sting! But the coolest thing about this creature? It will often throw its head back, stand on its hind legs and howl, just like a wolf. Wow!

#### MARICOPA HARVESTER ANT

"Did you know the most venomous creature in the state of Arizona is actually an ant?!" asks Ranger B. "The Maricopa harvester ant is 65 times more toxic than the diamondback rattlesnake. But luckily, it delivers thousands of times less venom per bite than the reptile! Drop for drop, though, this ant is the most toxic insect in the entire world!" Its bee-like stinger can inject victims repeatedly, too. The venom is mainly for defence, however, and the ant mostly eats seeds!



#### GILA" MONSTER

It might be the biggest lizard in the USA but this 60-cm pink and black venomous monster is tough to spot! "That's because the Gila monster spends around 95% of its life underground in burrows," explains Ranger B. "It hibernates through the winter, but during summer it hunts for eggs, baby birds and rodents in the morning and evening to avoid the scorching midday sun. The Gila monster doesn't have to eat very often, though, because it stores fat from its food in its chunky tail." Clever!

#### REGAL HORNED LIZARD

To avoid being gobbled by desert predators, such as hawks and coyotes, the regal horned lizard can keep remarkably still, camouflaging itself against the desert floor. But if that doesn't work, the bonkers beast has another, horrifying, trick up its sleeve... It squirts blood at its attackers - from its eyes! The foul-tasting red liquid shoots for up to a metre, and is usually enough to make a predator scamper off in disgust. We're not surprised!
