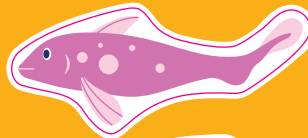
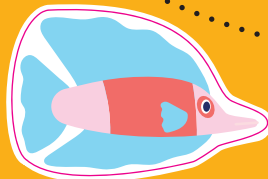

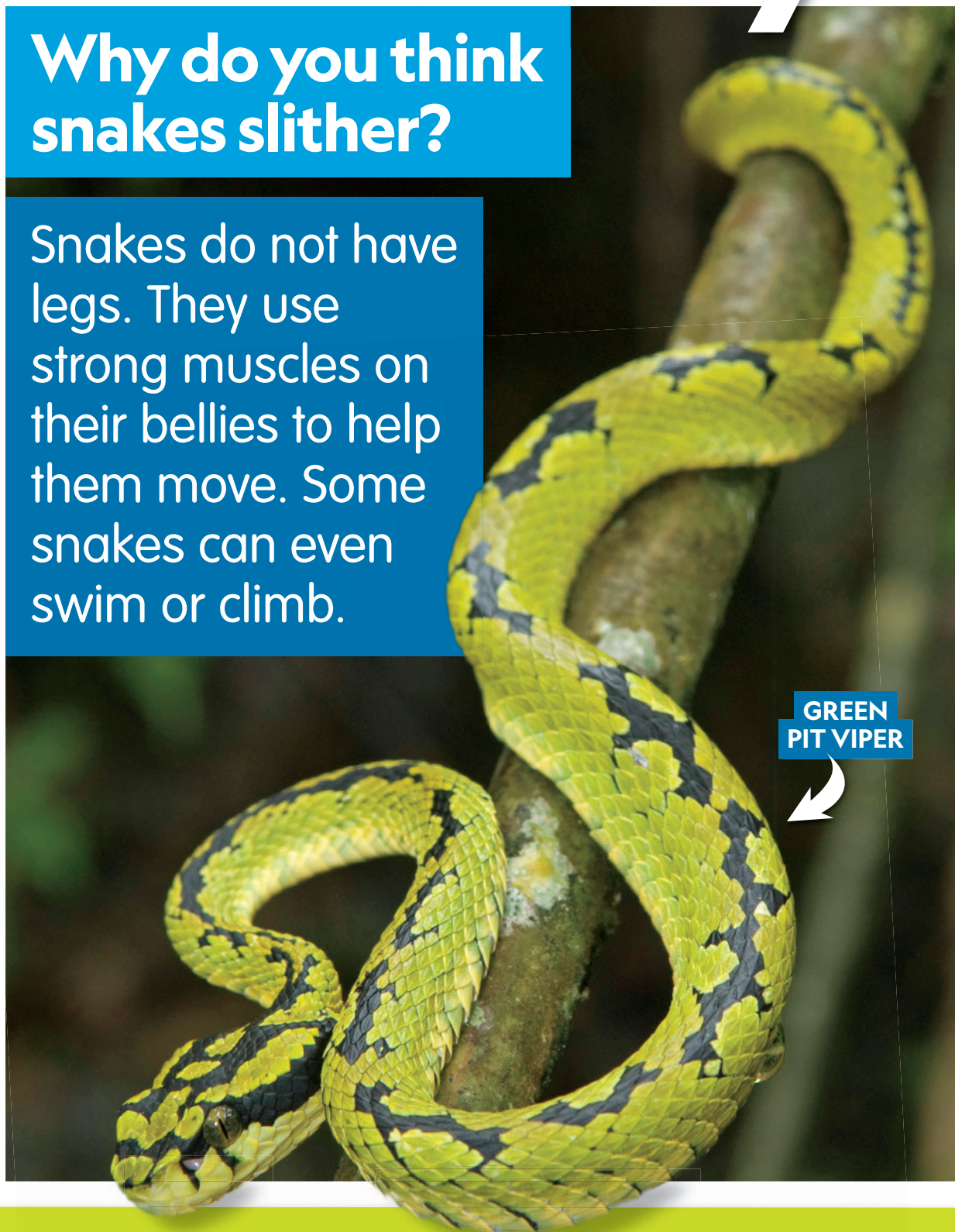




# Why?

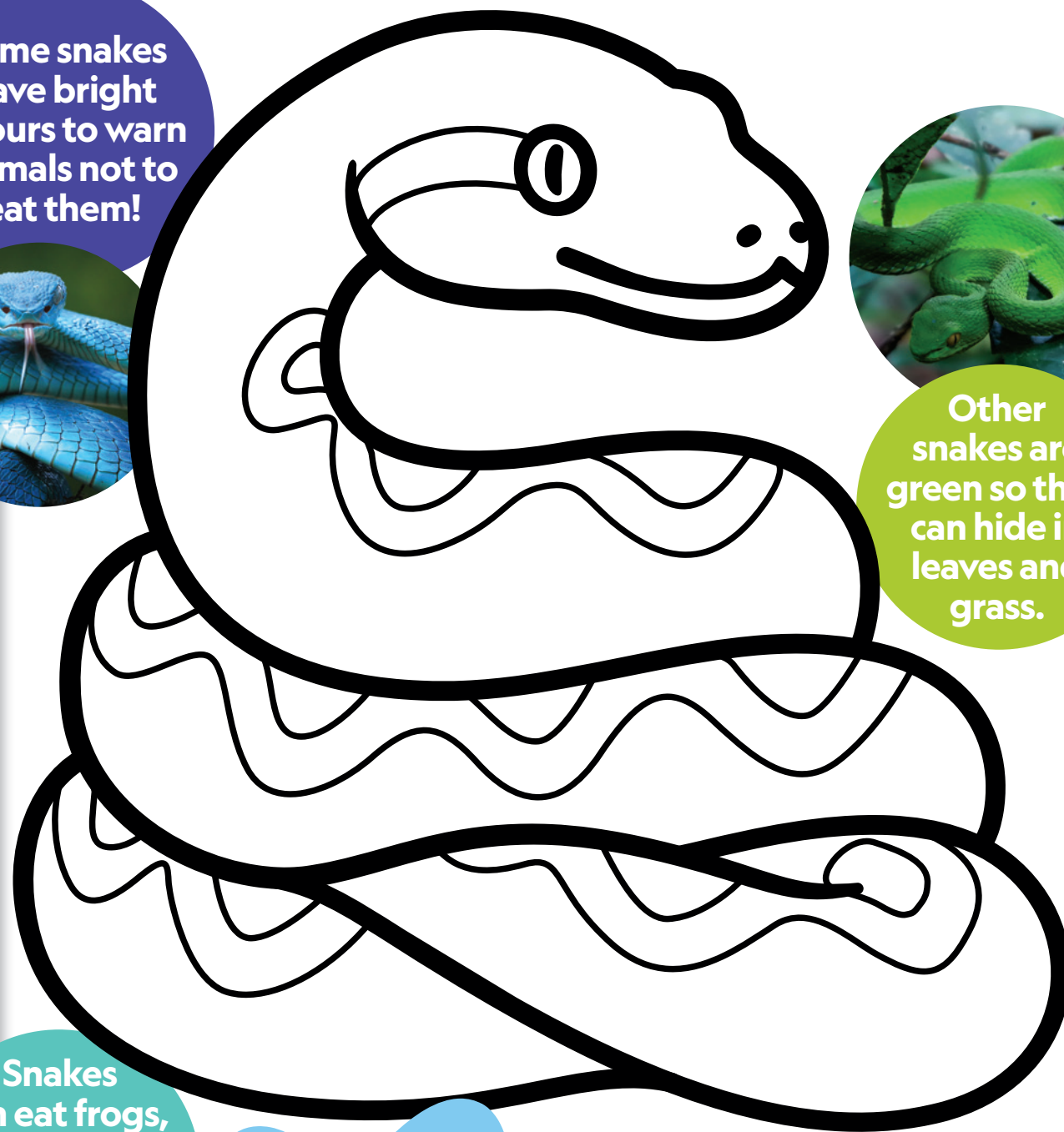

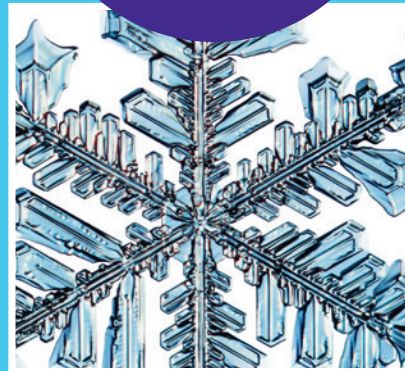

Fur helps keep the pup warm. Rich milk from Mum helps it up grow quickly.

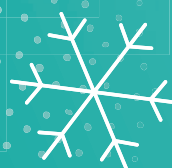
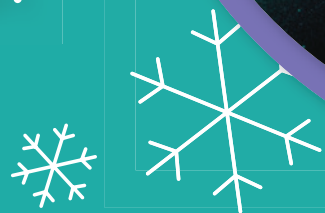
Soon Mum leaves the pup on its own. Now it needs to learn to catch its own food.

Camels have humps that store fat. They use the fat when they cannot find food.

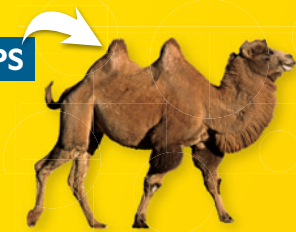
